The Interfaith Peace Walk is an opportunity to honor all the traditions in form or spirit. Please take this time to create the intention of peace for all in these times of chaos.

1. Hanuman Temple
Dedicated to Lord Hanuman, Hindu god of humility and service.



2. Dhuni
Fire is used to purify and cleanse.

3. Ganga Ghat
Steps leading into the Ganga pond, which symbolizes everlasting purity and lifegiving waters.

4. Hargobind Gurdwara
The 'house of the Guru' is dedicated to the Sikh religion and one of the great saints and teachers, Guru Hargobind.



5. Jewish Shrine
Dedicated to the formless G-d manifesting love in the form of the Ten Commandments.

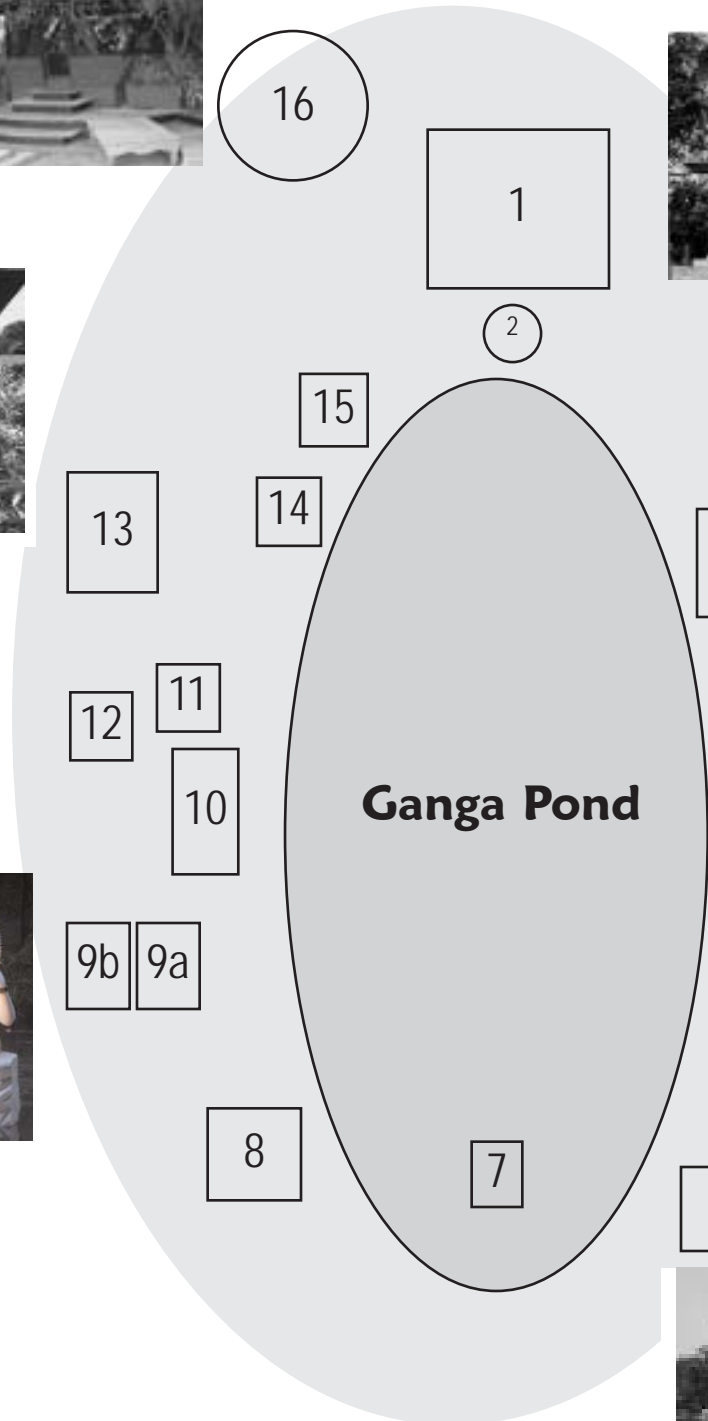
6. Christ Garden
Dedicated to the Christ who manifested to take on the pain of the world. Christ first appeared to Ma in 1972 instructing her to teach all ways.

7. Lord Shiva
Shiva is one of the main trinity of Hindu gods. Here he manifests in the form of an ascetic.



8. Buddha Garden
The Buddha embodies selflessness and compassion.

9a. Nandi and the Shiva Lingham
Linghams represent Lord Shiva, the male aspect. They are usually made from rocks found only in one river in India, and have unusual markings. Nandi the bull is Shiva's vehicle.



9b. Baba Siri Chand Temple
Baba Siri Chand is from the ascetic Sikh lineage of Udasi's.

10. Baba Temple
Dedicated to Ma's Guru, the great saint and teacher Neem Karoli Baba. To the left of Baba is Hanuman; on the right is the yoni lingham representing the merge of masculine and feminine.



11. Laxmi Shrine
Dedicated to the goddess of prosperity, shown here in her aspect of giving.

12. Jungle Kali
Dedicated to the form of the dark Mother who takes on the pain of humanity.



13. Swami Temple
Dedicated to Ma's beloved teacher, the great saint Swami Nityananda.



14. Healing Fountain
The healing waters of the Ganga flow from this stone in the form of a lingam.

15. Mother Mary
Mother of Christ, Mary represents the divinity of all women.

16. Mahavidya Temple & Labrynth
The outer stones symbolize Mother Kali in the form of the ten Mahavidyas. The middle stone represents God the Father in the form of Stanu, or light. Based on the famous labyrinth at Chartres in France, the labrynth is a meditation tool.
