built in the tradition of Sun Bear.

The Interfaith Peace Walk is an opportunity to honor all
traditions in form or spirit. As you walk we encourage you to
create the intention of peace for all peoples of the world.

1. Ganga Ghat

Steps leading into the Ganga, named after the sacred River Ganges in India.



2. Hargobind Gurdwara

The 'House of the Guru' is dedicated to the Sikh religion and one of the great saints and teachers, Guru Hargobind.



3. Ma's Paint Kuti

Ma Jaya was a prolific, spiritually inspired artist. This is where she created many of her paintings.



4. Jewish Shrine

Dedicated to the formless G-d manifesting love in the form of the Ten Commandments.

5. Christ Garden

When Christ first appeared to Ma in 1972, he instructed her to "teach all ways".



6. Lord Shiva

Shiva is one of the main trinity of Hindu gods; here in the form of an ascetic.

7. Buddha Garden

The Buddha embodies selflessness and compassion.

8a. Nandi and the Shiva Lingham

Linghams represent Lord Shiva, the male aspect. They are often made from rocks found in only one river in India. Nandi, the bull, is Shiva's special helper.



8b. Baba Siri Chand Temple

Son of Guru Nanak, Baba Siri Chand is from the ascetic Sikh lineage of Udasis.



9. Dhuni

Fire is universally used to purify and cleanse. During the year there are many fire puja ceremonies, or hawans, held here.



10. Baba Temple

Dedicated to Ma's Guru, the great Indian saint and teacher Neem Karoli Baba. To the left of Baba is Hanuman; on the right is the yoni lingham representing the merge of masculine and feminine.

11. Laxmi Shrine

Dedicated to the goddess of health, wealth, abundance and prosperity, Mother Laxmi is shown here in her aspect of giving.

12. Jungle Kali

Kali is the form of the dark Mother who has forsaken her own beauty to take on the pain of humanity.



13. Swami Temple

Dedicated to Ma's beloved teacher, the great saint Swami Nityananda.



14. Healing Fountain

The healing waters of the Ganga flow from this stone in the form of a lingam.

15. Mother Mary

The Mother of Christ, Ma always honored Mary's quiet strength.


16. Mahavidya Temple & Labyrinth

The outer stones represent ten forms of Mother Kali as Mahavidya. The center stone represents Lord Shiva in the form of Stanu, or light. Based on the French medieval labyrinth at Chartres Cathedral, the labyrinth is used for walking meditation.



17. Hanuman Temple

Dedicated to Lord Hanuman, Hindu god of humility and service, this is one of Kashi's first temples. Ma's paintings of Ganga River scenes decorate the ceiling.
